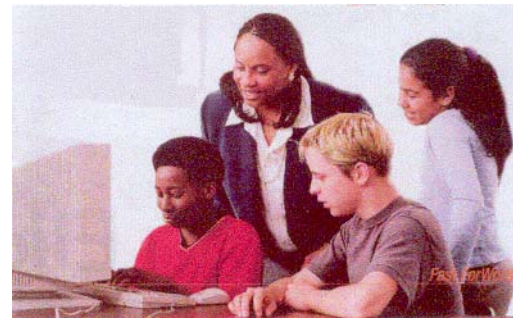


# Buffalo Hearing & Speech Center's

## Language to Literacy Computer Lab



### Program Description:

An after school and summer computer-based program for students to develop auditory processing, language and reading skills. Students work with speech-language pathologists on games that address phonological awareness, phonics, word recognition, spelling, reading fluency, working memory, vocabulary, and listening and reading comprehension.

Students progress through a hierarchy of programs as they improve, moving towards more advanced skills and grade levels. The skills targeted and design of the Fast Forward computer games are based in the latest neuroscience research and have a proven track record of success. It is like "aerobics for the brain."
